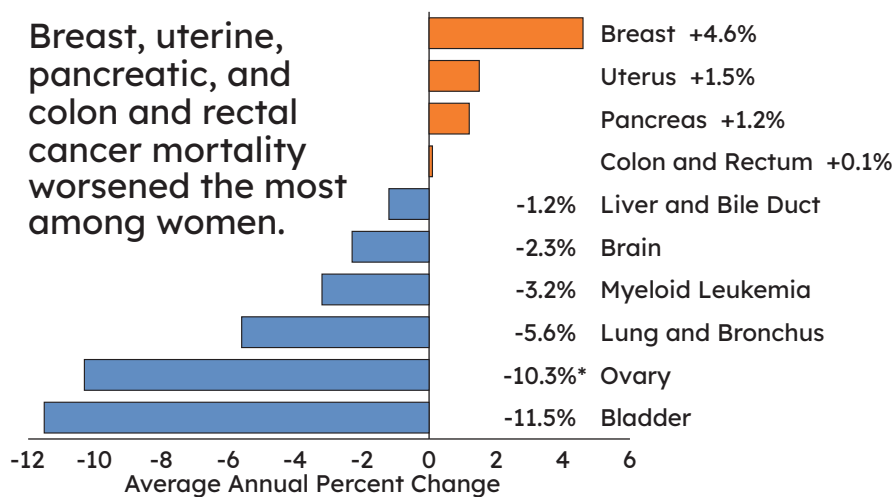

## Females

Bladder cancer mortality decreased the most among women.

↓ **11.5%**

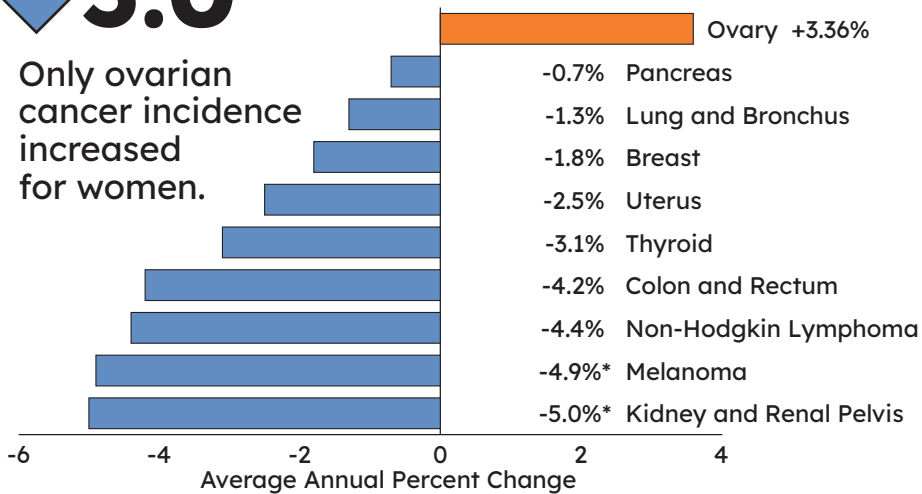
Breast, uterine, pancreatic, and colon and rectal cancer mortality worsened the most among women.



Kidney cancer incidence decreased the most among women.

↓ **5.0%**

Only ovarian cancer incidence increased for women.

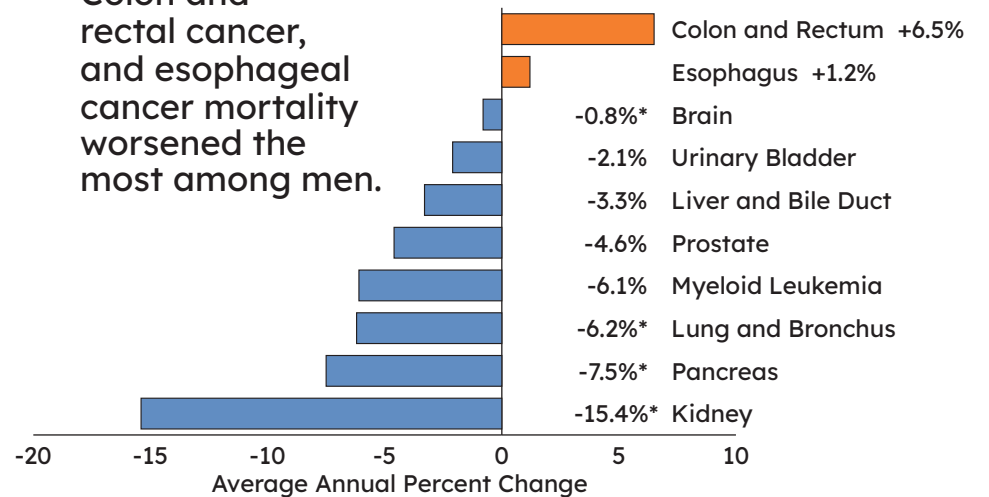


## Males

Kidney cancer mortality decreased the most among men.

↓ **15.4%**

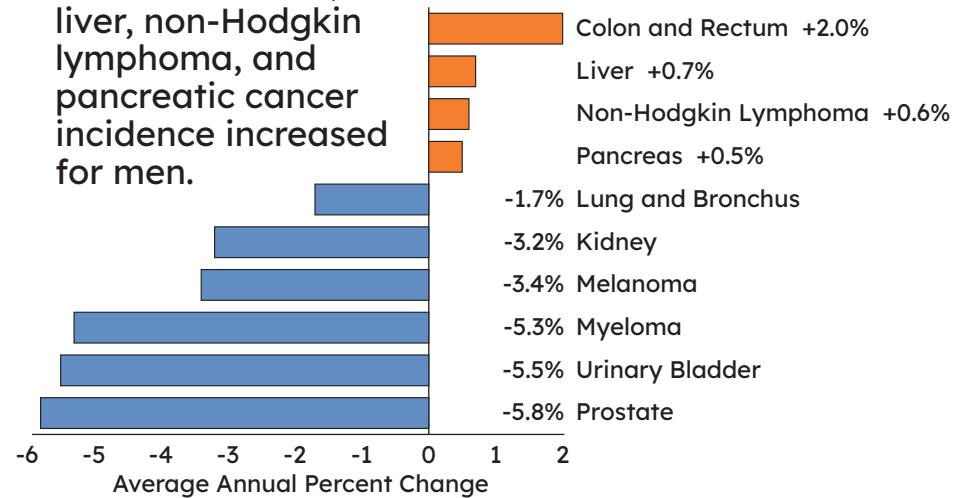
Colon and rectal cancer, and esophageal cancer mortality worsened the most among men.



Prostate cancer incidence decreased the most among men.

↓ **5.8%**

Colon and rectal, liver, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, and pancreatic cancer incidence increased for men.
